# Stepwise Planning Process

1. Get organized
2. Review and refine inventory & forecast of emissions
3. Identify a full range of possible actions
4. Identify initial priorities for analysis
5. Develop straw policy design proposals
6. Quantify initial GHG reductions and costs/savings
7. Fully develop policy option templates, including externalities, feasibility issues
8. Develop alternatives to address barriers as needed
9. Aggregate and integrate results
10. Finalize and report recommendations

- Complete the Catalog of Potential State Actions for Arkansas
- Develop recommendations on priority options for analysis for GCGW review/approval
- Develop recommendations for improving draft Arkansas GHG Inventory and Forecast

# Catalog of State Actions

# Notional Ratings

- We covered AFW 9, 10 and 11 in the previous meeting.
  - Further comments on those topics are welcome.
- Relative potential for GHG Emissions Reduction (Low, Medium, and High);
- Cost or Cost Savings per Ton of GHG reduction (Low, Medium, and High); and
- Other Considerations: Externalities, Feasibility.

# How Balloting Takes Place

- Once the Catalog is deemed complete, CCS develops and distributes a ballot via email to the TWG;
- TWG members indicate 10 priorities and return the ballots to CCS;
- CCS tallies the ballots and reviews the results during the next TWG call or via email;
- Recommended priority options may include bundled options that combine several individual actions from the catalog;
- GCGW will review and refine priorities;

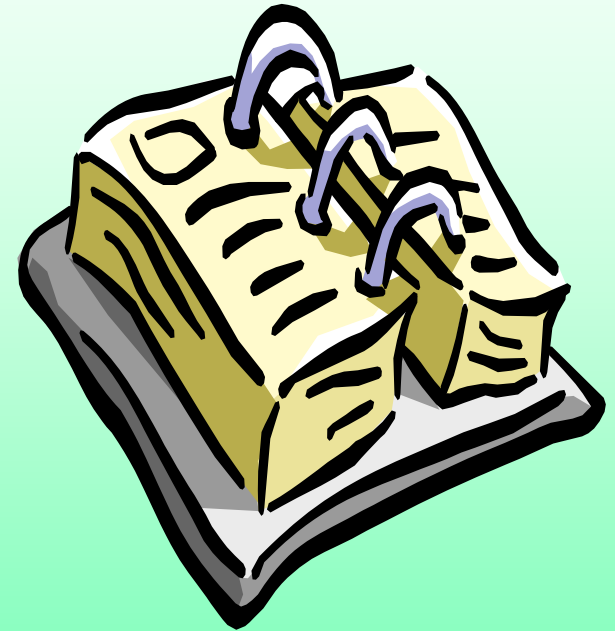
- Identify priorities for analysis from the catalog using the balloting process

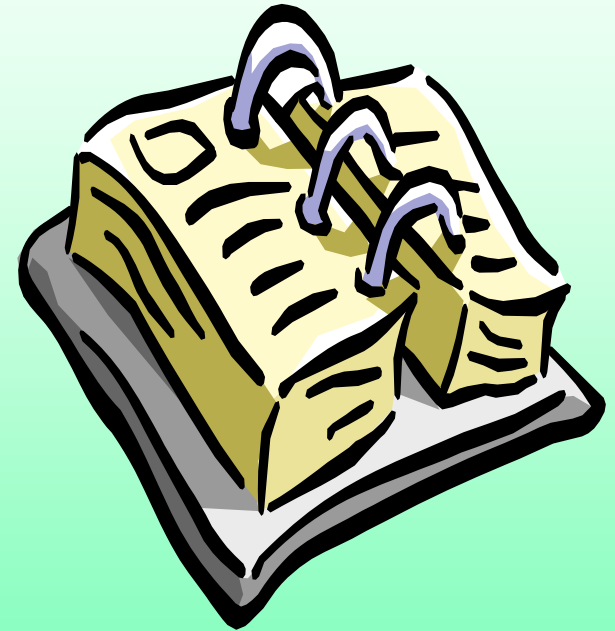
